

Why Not Try One Of These.....?

White Wine

Smederevka, Tikves , Macedonia 2017 £23.95
Based in the Republic of Macedonia, the Tikves winery was founded in 1885. Located in the Tikvesh region, the estate sustainably cultivates indigenous varieties such as Smederevka, Vrance and Kratosija. The grapes are vinified under the watchful eye of the illustrious oenologist Philippe Cambie, resulting in a series of award winning wines.

Blanc de l'Observatoire - Bekaa Valley, Lebanon 2016 £26.95
Château Ksara Blanc De L'Observatoire is an interesting blend of aromatic white grapes: 45% Sauvignon Blanc, 35% Muscat and 20% Clairette. The Sauvignon Blanc gives this wine its finesse and elegance, the Muscat its subtle flowery aroma and the Clairette its fruitiness, roundness and rich taste. Each wine is matured separately for three months in French oak casks, before being blended and bottled.

New Hall Signature Reserve - East Anglia, England 2014 £24.00
Established in 1969 in the village of Purleigh, this is one of the oldest wineries in England. The wine is made from Pinot Gris, Ortega & Scheurebe grapes, this wine is fresh, crisp, appley, dry, with medium body & a mineral-finish, making it a great aperitif, & would partner well with fish dishes, white meat & salads.

Malagouzia, Ktima Gerovassiliou, Epanomi, Greece 2017 £28.95
Ktima Gerovassiliou is the brainchild of Evangelos Gerovassiliou. He initiated the revival of the family vineyard by planting the nearly extinct Malagousia grape in 198. His estate is now 74 meticulously kept hectares on the slopes of Epanomi and his Malagousia is the benchmark for this grape still today.

Sauska Dry Furmint - Tokaj Hungary 2017 £24.95
A captivating expression of Hungary's most famous white grape. This Furmint offers intense aromas of peach, blood orange and herbs. The palate is dry leading to a satisfying fullness in the middle and a crisp grapefruit finish.

Red Wine

Syrah, Lismore Estates Vineyard, Western Cape, S. Africa 2016 £37.95
Samantha O'keefe has produced a truly stunning Syrah from the base of the Riviersonderend Mountains. 40% of the grapes are fermented in bunches in open vats and 60% in a wooden fermenter, then transferred into wooden barrels for malolactic fermentation. Afterwards they are blended in a wooden vat and aged for 10 months. The wine produced is exotic with cassis, blackberry and cherry on the nose with hints of white pepper and flowers. And smoked bacon. This is a light and elegant Syrah, truly unique !!!

Sauska Kekfrankos - Villany Hungary 2013 £29.95
Trophy winner Best Regional Wine - Decanter Magazine 2012
Bright immediate aroma of ripe berry fruit, white pepper & rosehip leads to a medium-bodied vibrant palate. The oak influence is super subtle, complimenting the natural spice & smoke notes of the Kekfrankos grape.

Chateau Ksara, Reserve du Couvent, Bekaa Valley Lebanon £27.95
Commended in the Sommelier Wine Awards 2015
Chateau Ksara is Lebanon's oldest winery. It can be traced back to 1857 when Jesuit monks acquired the property. Ksara is now the most modern winery in the region as well as the largest producer in the country. A complex aroma of cloves, vanilla & mulberry. On the palate it has blackberry fruits and supple tannins.

Zweigelt, Peter Schweiger - Kamptal, Austria 2015 £28.95
Weingut Peter Schweiger is a small, family owned producer based in the Kamptal region home to Austria's most highly regarded dry wines. Peter's sixteen hectares are devoted to Gruner Veltliner, Riesling and Zweigelt and farmed sustainably by hand. The Beaujolais of Austria, Zweigelt, served slightly chilled. this delicious red wine is juicy, lively and refreshing, with cherry and blackberry fruit. A winner on those hot days or lunchtimes !

Orange Wine

Esoterico Orange Wine - Unico Zelo, Clare Valley Australia 2016 £29. 95
It's not exactly white wine, nor red - many call it Orange or Amber wine. It's a purposeful blend of three white wine varieties, left on their skins (much like red wine) Muscat d'Alessandria (for its sweeter aromatics and waxy/oily mouthfeel), Bianco d'Alessano (for its acidity) and Riesling (for its astringency). There are no additions of any kind - save for sulphur when bottling the wine. There is no fining or filtration involved, with the wine allowed to clarify by gravity alone - resulting in a slight haze and sediment.

Fine Wines - White Wine

Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru 2013 Les Champs Gains Michel Bouzereau et fils, Burgundy, France £124.95
Michel produces a nervy and savoury style of wines that take a little longer to come out of their shell, but have an intense, racy quality that is well worth the wait.

Chateauneuf-du-Pape Blanc 'Magis' 2012 Rotem & Mounir Saouma Rhone France £132.95
The style of this wine is fascinating & unique -very much Chateauneuf viewed through a prism of Burgundy. The flavours are Grenache, but structurally, in their combination of delicacy & power, there is more than a little of the Cote d'Or Grand Cru about this wine

Corton-Charlemagne Grand Cru 2010 , Burgundy, France £142.95
Classic Corton-Charlemagne aromas of ripe green apple and fresh almonds lead to a full-bodied yet taut, mineral palate of great stature and concentration. An excellent example of this large but distinguished grand cru

Fine Wines - Red Wine

Chateau Kirwan 2012 Margaux Bordeaux £127.50
One of the best loved third growths in Medoc. It is situated in the commune of Cantenac, overlooking the Garonne estuary owned by the Schyler family since 1925. A medium bodied Margaux with good depth of cassis, blackberry & smoke and a freshness on the palate.

Brunello di Montalcino Riserva 2007 Poggia Antico Tuscany £134.95
A beautifully layered, expressive wine which caresses the palate with exceptional elegance, finesse & total class. Sage, rosemary, licorice & tobacco. This is without question one of the very best 2007 Riservas - *The Wine Advocate* June 2013

Nuits-Saint-Georges 1er Cru 2010 La Richemone Perrot-Minot Burgundy France £179.95
One of "The" Burgundy names. Its secret is old vines and minimal intervention- no racking, fining or filtration, resulting in a quite stunning wine

Chateau Musar - Bekaa Valley, Lebanon



97/'98/'99 - £56 **2006 - £53**

1997 - Big, well-balanced with a very slow fermentation. Exotic, smoky nose. Redcurrant, cinnamon and spice flavours with a fresh acidity. Definitely a Bordeaux-style vintage!!

1998 - A relatively pale, light vintage. Mature, classic with sweet cedary and spice aromas. Soft tannins and great length with graceful flavours of wheat and raisins.

1999 - Brilliant deep red with a nose full of red and black fruits. If 1997 was a Bordeaux style this vintage dofs its hat to the Rhône with nuances of vanilla and chocolate.

2006 - Beautiful deep ruby hue with lots of almost confected cherry, blackcurrant & cranberries on the nose with a hint of liquorice. Palate is hedgerow fruits, blueberries & cherries. A mid-weight vintage with excellent acidity & fine tannins. Released only in 2017, 4 years later than usual.
